Safety, ADS-B and 2020

– For those of you who have waited to decide what to do about upgrading your avionics to meet the 2020 ADS-B mandate, you're down to only one month remaining before the requirement goes into affect! Maybe some of you want to include that upgrade on your 2019 Christmas list ☺. All kidding aside, it's clear that Chapter 292 members take safety very seriously. That's probably why the VMC/IMC Club has seen it's attendance grow steadily since we rolled it out last Spring. Per the EAA, "While fatal accident totals in amateur-built aircraft remain at historic lows, a slight increase in the total for the last 12-month reporting period shows the continuing necessity for dedicated educational efforts to push the total even lower."



At our January 11th meeting, we will be having a representative from member Curt Cowley's FAA Safety Team (FAAST) give us an update on the ADS-B program rollout. As a previous skeptic, my belief was that the ADS-B program really just affected those who would be flying in congested airspaces such as *Bravo*, *Charlie* (and *Alpha*). After I equipped my new plane and began using it, I found that it was useful, no…really *essential*…even in the *Echo* and *Golf* airspaces that we routinely fly in. Remember, any aircraft with a functioning transponder shows up. You'll be amazed at the amount of GA traffic here in the Willamette Valley!

Thoughts About Our Fly-In — This past week, the Fly-In Committee Chairperson, Dave Ullman, called a meeting to discuss potential plans for our 2020 event. Looking back, Chapter 292 has had a rich history of successful fly-ins that provide a wonderful service for the experimental and general aviation community here in the Willamette Valley, and really across the entire West Coast. In 2017, we held the extrememely successful Solar-Eclipse 4-day event. Over the past two years, we have successfully incorporated the STOL Expo and competition on Sundays. Our speakers continue to be outstanding! Van's Homecoming has always been a cornerstone of the fly-in, but we are beginning to see less focus and interest, with fewer returning RVs for the Homecoming.

The Chapter 292 Executive Board and Fly-In Committee believes we are at a "crossroads" for the event. In some ways, we need to answer these two important question:

- 1) Why do we hold this event?
- 2) What should this event "be" going forward?

This past Summer, our event was "squeezed" from several directions...the main impact resulted from Arlington moving their fly-in so that it directly conflicted with our event schedule. We know that multiple businesses and potential attendees were affected by this...especially those in the Washington & BC areas. Also, we had a fantastic group of new volunteers to the Committee, and it took some time for everone to learn their duties and "gel" together. Even so, we had a great fly-in that met, or exceeded all of our expectations. Very Impressive!

<u>High expectations are part of our problem</u>. Every year, our goal is to exceed the previous year, as compared by our basic metrics; attendee count, money generated, and quality of our speakers & programs. As you would expect, it's impossible to raise the bar, and then meet those goals year-after-year. And what happens when we don't meet our goals? There is a general sense of dissapointment, despite that we put together an outstanding program and event! The definition of insanity is "Doing the same thing over-and-over, and expecting different results..."



So, the Chapter needs to ask itself..."What does success look like?" Don't get me wrong, I'm not prognosticating "gloom-and-doom" for the event. What I'm suggesting, is that we continue to challenge ourselves to put on the best event it can be, and constantly looking for ways to improve or evelove the event. We don't want to follow the path of Arlington where you see-and-hear the same thing year-after-year. There's little wonder why that event is dying! Companys go through this all the time. The industry changes, markets evolve and companies need to adjust their strategies and products to compensate. The Fly-In is Chapter 292's product!

With that in mind, we need some creative minds to help with the planning and execution of our 2020 event. After 2 great years, Dave Ullman is stepping down to a position where he can assist, but not lead. We need a leader and committee members to get out in front of this and be able to answer the previously asked questions. Unfortunately, doing nothing and cancelling the event is also one of the options if we don't get the leadership positions filled.

- Mike is out of town this week; Jerry Price is running today's meetings as acting VP.
- Jerry went over the vote that will be taken during the general meeting for the dues increase.
 - Chuck is going to pay for Minet services for the month of December. then the chapter will pay starting the first of the year. Jerry talked about the router in the club house. Jerry is concerned the router may need to be upgraded. More investigation is needed first.
 - I brought up that dues for the next year can be accepted now. This needs to be mentioned after the vote.
- Sec report Membership now stands at 205 in good standing (24 lifetime, 175 annual paid, 6 student)
- Treasure Report
 - Ray Scholarship Anders still has \$1,4350 left to spend on his next ratings. He is working on his tailwheel endorsement now.
 - Simulator fund \$7K
 - Youth fund \$10K

 - General Fund \$16K
- VMC/ IMC club held the first joint meeting,27 people attended. Plan to continue with that format.
- Bylaw change discussion -
- Donations for Endowments- Dave U.
 - Jerry is wondering how we would handle any accounts like this, who would be authorized to manage and disperse. Thinks this should be outside the board, and a plan in place to manage with transparency.
 - Steve Heinrich is being talked to about helping with this. Still working to figure it out.
 - Also talking to EAA National about helping setting this up.
- Youth Al RV 12 wing is coming together. Still discussion about finding a buyer for the project.
 - o Bruce is still working to make this a 12si.
 - A set of RV-12 tail feathers were donated to the chapter, Al might use those as a project for the kids to rebuild.
 - o Al might have a person that might take on the Youth Chairmanship.
 - Ernie Kids group will rent 1/2 a bay, Bob Esh will take the other 1/2. This would make the hangar 100% occupied.
 - Chapter has been gifted a Tridactyl ultralight. Use that as a project for the kids, then sell. It is currently in Ernie's hangar.
 - We need \$55,000 for the 12is fuselage kit.
 - o Dave suggested that we talk at the General meeting about the 12is project is for sale.
 - o Dave also talked about Bob Gillett might donate his Pulsar2 project.
 - Vince 3 new kids have started on the entry level projects.

 - Bob Ingle reported his FMX-4 is ready to close.




- One gentleman (sorry did not catch his name) talked about his Pietenpol Air Camper he is working on covering – it will have a Ford Model A engine.
